

Apollo Memorial Library (AML) Policy: Wireless Internet Access

The Library offers free wireless access for library patrons to use with their own personal notebooks, laptops, tablets, handheld and other mobile devices.

The Apollo Memorial Library is committed to serving the information, recreation, and lifelong learning needs of all of its patrons, and providing access to the Internet enables the Library to expand its information services amidst changing community needs.

The unauthorized or illegal use of the Apollo Memorial Library's computing systems and facilities may result in revocation of Internet use privileges, general library privileges, and/or constitute grounds for civil or criminal prosecution. All users are expected to use the library's wireless access in a legal and responsible manner, consistent with the educational and informational purposes for which it is provided. The Apollo Memorial Library prohibits the following:

- Accessing obscene or pornographic sites
- Engaging in any activity that facilitates sending, receiving or displaying inappropriate materials to a minor;
- Activities that disrupt the library or its network
- Violating U.S. Copyright Law or software licenses
- Peer to Peer file sharing

Wireless access points are unsecured; therefore the transfer of financial and other personal data is at your own risk. The library is not responsible for any information (ex. Credit card) that is compromised, or for any damage caused to your hardware or software due to electric surges, security issues, service interruptions, and consequences caused by viruses or hacking. AML cannot control and is not responsible for, the content or accuracy of information accessed over the internet. AML is not liable for direct, indirect or consequential damages related to the use of information accessed through AML's wireless internet access.

Laptop, notebook, tablet, handheld and other mobile device users must be considerate of patrons nearby and refrain from excessive noise. Patrons not adhering to this policy may be asked to leave the library.

The library is not responsible for laptop, notebook, tablet, handheld and other mobile devices left unattended.

Printing can be made available for laptop computer users and air print compliant devices. Saved files can be copied on a digital storage medium and brought to the public access workstations and used once they have been scanned for virus and malware. The library is not responsible for data loss that may occur while printing.

The library respects the privacy of internet use and will make every effort to protect the privacy rights of adults and minors, and will revoke internet privileges of library users who attempt to violate these rights.

For each use a library wireless access user will be required to do an online sign-in agreeing to the terms and conditions of the library policy prior to gaining access to the internet. It is the responsibility of the parent or legal guardian to monitor minors' (those under 18) use of the AML wireless internet access.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE WIRELESS INTERNET ACCESS POLICY MAY RESULT IN LOSS OF ACCESS TO THE INTERNET OR REMOVAL FROM LIBRARY PROPERTY AT THE LIBRARIAN'S DISCRETION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LIBRARY'S BEHAVIOR POLICY.
